Who is Wake LRC?

Local Reentry Council (LRC) is a collaborative of organizations working to help men and women transition back into the community.

What support does the Wake LRC offer?

Direct Services:

- Case management for up to 6 months
- Assistance with basic needs (food, clothing, transportation)
- Housing navigation
- Financial assistance for training and education
- Behavioral health care navigation

Partner Referrals:

- Employment and job training
- Mental health and recovery services
- Medical, dental and vision care
- Legal aid
- Veteran services

Who do we serve?

- Individuals 18 and older
- Individuals within 2 years of release from jail or prison
- Wake County Residents

What is required from me?

- Participate in a minimum of 2 monthly case management sessions.
- Participate in case plan activities
